From a New Teacher

On May 22^{nd,} Banbury celebrated its 35th anniversary at the Valley Ridge Golf and Country Club. Among the 180 guests were past and present staff, students, alumni, friends and family. It was heart-warming to witness the crowds who gathered to celebrate Banbury and its' "radical" pedagogy since its very beginning.

Upon entering the venue, guests could view student art-work that was showcased along a short hallway which led into a ballroom where a silent auction and slide show could be viewed. Silent auction items ranged from dinner and spa packages, to gift baskets carefully put together by elementary students and parents. Items included donations from parents and local shops and businesses, demonstrating the community's support for Banbury.

Throughout the night I quietly followed around my mentor Tara Fry, a woman whose wing I couldn't wait to get under. As she danced lightly around the room greeting parents, students, and alumni, I caught a first glimpse at the imperative role Banbury teachers played in not just the academic lives of their students, but in their personal lives as well. The appreciation and connection the guests and Tara had with one another made the event feel like a family reunion.

After a quality buffet of fresh salads, vegetables, and roast beef, the school's founder and director, Diane Swiatek, gave a heart-felt welcome to her guests as we sat down for coffee and dessert. Shortly after, a handful of alumni provided testimonials of their experiences at Banbury, and it is then that that I was truly taken back in time. For the first time, I was able to digest exactly what it meant to be a part of the Banbury community. As alumni expressed their gratitude and very personal experiences, it was evident that students truly grew up academically and personally through Diane's vision of self-directed learning. What was even more evident were the ways in which they indirectly recalled the sacrifices both big and small that Diane made throughout their time at Banbury to facilitate their growth and learning in ways that suited them all individually. Some of these students are now business owners, Ph.D students, and educators. On Friday, the root of their success was mostly attributed to Banbury's ability and willingness to allow students to direct their own learning and creativity in ways that eliminated academic and social pressures, and fostered personal and academic growth.

Before a night of dancing began, Diane awarded both long and short term teachers and students, recognizing their dedication to Banbury. The gratitude that was expressed could truly be felt in the air as tears were shed, and gifts with personal touches were presented to Banbury's support system.

As a new teacher to Banbury, and prior public education employee, this experience warmed my heart and soul in a way that reaffirmed my decision to take on a role at Banbury. I hope this anniversary was not the first and last that I will have the pleasure to attend.
